### An NCJW Scholarship Recipient Still Giving Back

In 1955, Larry Steiner, a University of Michigan college student, did not have enough money to continue his schooling and was faced with the prospect of having to drop out of college. The Detroit Section of the National Council of Jewish Women came to his aid and made it possible for him to continue his education and graduate as an architect. Over a period of fifty-six years Mr. Steiner has given to the NCJW Scholarship Fund in thanks. This year our Section received a very generous donation in honor of the Bar Mitzvahs of two young men, Riki and Kaz Newton, which will be used to help fund our intern from JVS' Kohn Summer Internship Program.

Thank you, Mr. Steiner, for your generous donations over the years. We are very glad that NCJW helped you achieve your educational aspirations. The San Francisco Section has given over two hundred educational scholarships to worthy students since its establishment.

### Our Voice in the Capital Protecting Women's Health

The Voices for Reproductive Choices emergency campaign was born in March as a result of an attack on women's health rights by Republican congressmen in the House of Representatives. NCJW Sections across our good nation quickly rallied their allies to spread the message of the benefits of supporting pro-choice legislation and pro-family planning.



NCJW's voice was heard in letters-to-the-editors, petition drives, district lobby visits, and at press conferences. Our efforts were a huge success - **NCJW nationally gathered over 5,500 petition signatures in less than a month! SF Section Volunteers collected 400 of those signatures at our Petition Rally on March 27th.** These signatures were delivered to members of Congress during lobby visits as part of Stand Up For Women's Health Lobby Day on April 7th. NCJW activists joined 30 other organizations in sponsoring this critical day of action and penning an Interfaith Statement opposing restrictions and the limiting of federal funding for women's health care.

### Spring Luncheon Features Theater and Learning

On Thursday, March 31<sup>st</sup>, 62 NCJW Members and Friends gathered at Temple Emanu-El for our Spring Luncheon, featuring a musical performance of "Cinderella" by our Children's Drama Service and a lecture by Dr. Era Loewenstein on "The Healing Power of Fairy Tales". The Emanu-El preschool was invited to the performance and our actors had the kids up singing and dancing along with them. Dr. Loewenstein's talk was riveting. She described the history of the fable of Cinderella, its roots in many cultures, and its usefulness in children's learning.
